Getting to the church

St Chad is a Georgian church, topped by a dome and gold cross, which can be seen from most directions. It is in the centre of Shrewsbury, within a loop of the river Severn; the postcode is SY1 1JX. Whether driving or walking, a street plan will be useful. The central area has a complex one-way system: we recommend you park in one of the large, long stay car parks outside the river loop.

Car Parking

Abbey car park is opposite the Abbey church, near the English Bridge; the postcode is SY2 6AH.

Frankwell car park is next to the theatre, near the Welsh Bridge; the post code is SY3 3RD.

There is a small, paying car park at the church. Disabled badge holders may request a space to be reserved.

Details of the town car parks can be found on originalshrewsbury.co.uk

There are also 3 Park and Ride schemes, the closest of which is Oxon (shropshire.gov.uk/parkandride).

Council car parks use the MIPermit app as well as, usually, contactless or cash options.

From the railway station, walk uphill, Castle Foregate, to the market cross, then ahead down the pedestrian precinct. You can see St Chad's church ahead.
